**THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:**

**COUNT ONE**

**THEFT OF CONTENTS OF MAIL  
(18 U.S.C. 1708, first paragraph)**


On or about June 2, 2010, within the Southern District of Texas, Houston Division, the defendant,

**ANDRE H. MOORE**

did knowingly steal, take from, and/or abstract from, or by fraud or deception, obtains, and attempts to obtain, from or out of any mail, post office, or station thereof, letter box, mail receptacle, mail route, mail carrier, or other authorized depository for mail matter, any letter, postal card, package, bag, or mail, and abstracts or removes from any such letter, bag, package, or mail, any article or thing contained therein, and secretes, embezzles, or destroys any such letter, postal card, package, bag, or mail, being more specifically that defendant **MOORE**, while being authorized by his employer, The Sisters Of Charity Of The Incarnate Word (hereinafter referred to as the "Sisters") to pick up


the mail sent and addressed to and for the Sisters from their Post Office Box at the Eastwood Post Office in Houston Texas, did in fact pick up the Sisters' mail at that post office on June 2nd, 2010, and then knowingly and fraudulently (and without authorization) open several items of the Sisters' mail and then remove for his own benefit certain valuable articles, namely cash and gift cards, from the opened mail, all of which were mailed to and addressed to the Sisters and not to the defendant;

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1708, first paragraph.
